Entry requirements	Grade 6 in Photography or Art
Course description	<p>Students will explore a range of textile media, processes and techniques being aware of both traditional and new media. Each is assessed using four objectives.</p> <p>1: Develop ideas through sustained and focused investigations informed by contextual and other sources, demonstrating analytical and critical understanding.</p> <p>2: Experiment with and select appropriate resources, materials, techniques and processes, reviewing and refining ideas as work develops.</p> <p>3: Record in visual and/or other forms, ideas, observations and insights relevant to their intentions, demonstrating ability to reflect on work and progress.</p> <p>4: Present a personal, informed and meaningful response demonstrating critical understanding, realising intentions and, where appropriate, making connections between visual, written, oral or other elements.</p> <p>Students will explore the use of drawing for different purposes, using a variety of methods on a variety of scales.</p> <p>Work from one or more areas listed below will be required, these may be overlapped/ combined to suit student's particular strengths: Fashion design; Fashion textiles; Costume design; Installed textiles; Digital textiles; Printed and/or dyed fabric and materials; Domestic textiles and wallpaper; Interior design; Constructed textiles; Art textiles; Installed textiles</p>
Assessment	The A Level is assessed in units equating to 60% from coursework and 40% from exam work. This course is linear.
Progression	Many students go straight to university to study a textiles/fashion degree or onto a foundation course.
Related Courses	Textiles can be taken alongside many subjects including Art, Photography, DT or even English, Maths or Science.
